Negative Inversion for Emphasis

In formal English, when we begin a sentence with a negative or restrictive adverbial (like 'Not only', 'Seldom', or 'Rarely'), we invert the subject and the auxiliary verb to add emphasis.

- *Not only does social media raise awareness, but it also creates communities.*
- *Seldom have we seen such a rapid shift in public perception.*
- *Rarely do individuals find accurate medical advice on short-form video apps.*
